- If there is only one entrant in a category in our state, he/she automatically represents Colorado in the West Central Division Competition. Colorado offers all Representatives the opportunity to play for comments that will help them prepare for the Division Competition.
- The West Central Division Competitions will be held January 9-11, 2015 at University of North Dakota, Fargo, North Dakota.
